Coity, Mid Glamorgan, St Mary



The clock hour bell struck on the tenor of the ring of six. The Trust located a second-hand bell which has been installed as the “new” hour bell. It came from the remodelled ring at Coggeshall, Essex. In 2007 we supplied a second bell which is to be used as a service bell.

Llanbedr Ystrad Yw, Powys, St Peter



The ring of five bells was augmented to six during 2007 by the addition of a second-hand bell from Rusper, Sussex. The ring of five bells was re-hung in a six-bell frame by Taylor's of Loughborough in 1939.

Llansilin, Powys, St Silin



The ring of four was augmented to six during 1999 with a new bell and a second-hand Mears & Stainbank bell from Brimpsfield, Gloucestershire.

Mynyddislwyn, Gwent, St Tudor



Although the Trust was not involved in the re-locating of the chime of bells formerly hung at St Luke's, Abercarn, Gwent to Mynyddislwyn, we did financially assist the bell-installation project. Mynyddislwyn was one of the many churches that applied for but did not receive a *Ring-in-the-Millennium* grant. Bravely they decided to continue with their fund-raising to complete the project. It is a shame that three of the chime were stolen from St Luke's church before they could be safely removed. New bells have had to be cast to replace them thus increasing the costs of the project. The ring of eight bells was dedicated during September 2000.

Nevern, Dyfed, St Brynach



The unringable ring of six is to be restored and augmented to eight. The Keltek trust is donating two bells, ex-Brockville, Canada which are expected to become the 6th and 7th of the restored ring. In addition we are providing a service bell.

Porth, Glamorgan, St Paul



The chime of eight bells was removed from the redundant church of St Paul, Porth during the last week of May 2015. The back four bells have been installed at Kirkham, Lancashire, St Michael and the front four are in storage awaiting relocation.

Prestatyn, Clwyd, Christ Church



Christ Church was the first church where an ex-Trinity House buoy bell has been hung as part of a full-circle ringing peal of bells. The heaviest three of the pre-2003 clock chime are the 2nd, 5th and tenor of the ring. The ex-Trinity House bell is the 3rd and a surplus bell from London is the treble; the ring being completed by a new bell. The two surplus chiming bells have been acquired by a bell-hanger for a project.
