Subject to faculty and fund-raising it is hoped to restore and augment the unringable ring of three bells to a ring of six. We are donating a bell ex-St Annes on the Sea which after tuning should be suitable as the second of six.

Hartington, Derbyshire, St Giles



A ring of six bells formerly hung at Stanton-in-Peak, Derbyshire along with two newly cast treble bells was installed during 2007. The Trust acquired the ex-Stanton ring as part of the project to install a lighter ring more in keeping with the tower structure at Stanton. The existing unringable ring of three bells at Hartington has been retained.

Morley, Derbyshire, St Matthew



The ring of three was augmented to four during 2002 with a bell located by the Trust. It had previously been hung for chiming at Highcliffe, Dorset before being installed at Morley.

Stanton-in-Peak, Derbyshire, Holy Trinity



The front four bells of the St Mary, Highfield St, Liverpool chime have been installed as the back four of a light ring of six at Stanton-in-Peak, Derbyshire. The pre-2003 ring of bells (tenor weight 10 cwt) at Stanton were considered too large and heavy for the tower and had not been rung full-circle in living memory. These have now been transferred to nearby Hartington as the back six of the ring of eight.
