Adlestrop, Gloucestershire, St Mary Magdalene



The unringable ring of five bells was restored and augmented during 2016. The pre-2016 ring was considered too heavy for the tower and has been remodelled into a lighter ring using the old 4th as tenor of the ring of six. The cracked tenor bell was scrapped and the old 2nd bell has been relocated at Pillerton Hersey, Warwickshire.

Brimpsfield, Gloucestershire, St Michael




A surplus bell from Brimpsfield has been relocated at St Silin, Llansilin, Powys.

Cheltenham, Gloucestershire, St Mary



The pre-2017 ring has been replaced with a newly cast ring of twelve bells. The Trust assisted the appeal committee by relocating several bells.

It is hoped the 4th bell will be installed at Lathbury, Buckinghamshire as part of the project to restore and augment the unringable ring of five bells and the 2^{nd} and 6^{th} bells have been installed at Hawton, Nottinghamshire.

English Bicknor, Gloucestershire, St Mary the Virgin




The ring of five had been unringable for many years and were restored and augmented to six during 2007. The Trust located a small chiming bell that was installed at the same time the ring was restored.

Gloucester, Gloucestershire, St Michael's Tower



The former church of St Michael possessed a ring of ten bells up until 1956 when the two trebles were transferred to the Cathedral (recast 1978) and the remaining eight bells were scrapped. The Gloucester Civic Trust has installed one bell (ex-High Wycombe) in part of the former frame.



Two bells from the pre-2012 ring of eight at Stone, Staffordshire cast by Abraham Rudhall in 1710 at the Gloucester Bell Foundry have been put on display in St Michael's tower. Rudhall's Bell Foundry was situated close to St Michael's tower.




The ex-High Wycombe bell installed in part of the original bellframe.

Horton, Gloucestershire, St James



The long derelict ring of five bells has been restored and augmented to six. The cracked, under-sized and under-weight tenor bell has been replaced by the former tenor from Writtle, Essex donated to the project by the Keltek Trust. After many delays the scheme was completed during 2010.

Norton, Gloucestershire, St Mary



Prior to 2024 the ring of bells were out of tune. The listed 4th bell cast by Abraham Rudhall in 1685, has been replaced by a bell ex-Garthbrengy donated by the Keltek Trust.

Prinknash Abbey, Gloucestershire



The Keltek Trust acquired the chime of eight bells from Prinknash Abbey during May 2015. The bells had been installed in a temporary structure awaiting installation into the Abbey tower. However it was never built and the bells have not rung out as they were originally intended but hung dead and chimed by hammers.

The 6th and 7th bells have been installed at Laxfield, Suffolk along with six newly cast treble bells.

The 5^{th} and tenor bells have replaced the two Hugh Watts bells (7th and tenor) at Kempston, Bedfordshire.

The front four bells are now the back four of the ring of eight at Holy Trinity, Roehampton.

Siston, Gloucestershire, St Anne




Subject to Faculty and fund-raising it is hoped to replaced the cracked 4th bell with a surplus bell from Stowmarket, Suffolk.

During 2011 the ring of five was augmented to six by adding the pre-2010 4th bell from Prittlewell, Essex.

Tibberton, Gloucestershire, Holy Trinity



During 1999 the ring of two bells was augmented to three by the addition of a modern but surplus bell. The parish were keen to augment to a ring of five and two more second-hand bells also located by the Trust were installed during 2004.

Tredington, Gloucestershire, St John the Baptist


The ring of five was augmented to six with the addition of a surplus bell from the pre-1995 ring at Bishopstoke, Hampshire. The work was completed during 1998.

Wapley, South Gloucestershire, St Peter



During 2000 the small village of Wapley completed the restoration of its ring of five bells. For many years they had been considered difficult to ring by visiting bell-ringers. An inspection showed the frame was mobile and causing damage to the tower structure; the poor condition of the bell-fittings were a cause for concern, those on the tenor being so bad the bell could no longer be rung safely.

The restoration involved the re-modelling of the ring into a lighter ring of six with the existing tenor being disposed of. The Trust was asked to find a home for this bell and it has now been installed at St Stephen's church, Stanley, Hong Kong.
