

Corby Glen, Lincolnshire, St John the Evangelist



The ring of five was augmented to six by adding the pre-2010 3rd bell from St Albans Abbey and replacing the existing treble with the pre-2010 4th bell from St Albans Abbey. The work was completed during February 2013.

The old treble has been installed at Catworth, Cambridgeshire as the treble of six.

Hackthorn, Lincolnshire, St Michael



Five bells acquired from the pre-2001 ring of six at St Blaise, Milton, Oxfordshire have been hung as the back five of the ring of six bells. The Trust donated the tenor bell and the installation work was completed during 2006.



Lincoln, Lincolnshire, St Benedict

Marshchapel, Lincolnshire, St Mary the Virgin



The ring of three bells has been restored and augmented to six by adding three surplus bells donated by the Keltek Trust. The additional bells were the 2nd, 3rd & 4th of the pre-2023 ring from Rochdale, St Chad.

North Scarle, Lincolnshire, All Saints



The unringable ring of three bells has been restored and augmented to six. The Trust donated the 2nd and 3rd bells of six. The smaller bell came from Marden Ash, Essex and the larger bell from a metal dealer also in Essex. The work was completed during June 2015.

Potterhanworth, Lincolnshire, St Andrew



The ring of three have been augmented to six with the addition of three bells provided by the Trust. They include a bell from the redundant church at New Shildon, Co. Durham; a bell from Llandybie quarry Wales and an ex-Trinity House buoy bell. The augmented ring was dedicated on 4th September 2004.

Tealby, Lincolnshire, All Saints



The original ring of four bells date from the early 15th century (treble) to 1704 for the W. Noone tenor bell. The bells were re-hung in a modern six-bell frame some years ago and the project was to add two bells to complete the ring. An initial enquiry made to the Trust resulted in a choice of bells for the treble of six. We were aware of the immediate availability of a bell cast by Newcombe dated 1614 and of a modern Gillett & Johnston bell, the latter owned by the Trust. The parish decided to acquire the modern bell and obtained a suitable second-hand headstock and wheel to fit.

The Trust located another bell to complete the ring. The surplus bell came from the church of St Andrew, Plymouth and has been tuned to become the 2nd of the ring of six. The augmented ring was re-dedicated on November 17th 2001.
